Christian Education: thinking about mathematics (from the LCS Curriculum Delivery Plan)

Beliefs About Teaching Mathematics: Students at Liberton Christian School will be encouraged to develop the knowledge, skills, understandings and attitudes which results in them learning to recognise mathematics as an integral part of God's creation. In their learning, they will be encouraged to recognise and appreciate the relevance and need for mathematical thinking in everyday life. In a range of meaningful contexts, they will be engaged in knowing, doing, and thinking mathematics teaching is underpinned by the Christian Education writer Harro Van Brummelen who suggests," children learn from talking about mathematics, discussing problems and contributing to solutions. The mathematics classroom is a forum for mathematical discussion," *[Walking with GOD in the Classroom, page 107].*

Numeracy teaching:

Teachers will organise their students into instructional groups based on the strategy stages for each operational domain of the NZ Number Framework.

A typical Numeracy lesson may consist of the following:

5 – 10 minutes whole class	Warm Up	Number Knowledge teaching related to knowledge hotspots / needs;
15–20 minutes group rotations	Group Teaching	Specific Strategies / Knowledge teaching at group Stage / Level
5 – 10 minutes whole class	Warm Down	May include class sharing, discussion of a key idea that has arisen, demonstration of independent activities, student reflection, journal writing.

Group instructional teaching time will be followed by practise directly related to strategy teaching. It will generally be preceded by knowledge activities appropriate to the group's knowledge needs.
