2017 Parent Survey Summary Report from the Board of Trustees

The board of trustees greatly appreciated the response to the term 4 parent survey. This was the first time an online survey had been used and the considerably higher response level suggests that this is a successful method to gauge parent views on some areas of school life. There were twelve questions in the survey and the board received forty-six responses.

For the questions in the survey that related to our learning environment and operational aspects of the school (safety, home and school partnership, future schooling preparation, communication) the responses were very positive ranging from 98%-100% affirming we are doing well. A number of encouraging comments or suggestions for improvement were made across these topics and these are appreciated and have generated further conversation at the staff and board level.

Question 3 asked about the information you receive regarding your child's progress and learning. 87% were satisfied with the information we provide. We will be reviewing our written report formats this year and hope we can improve the information we provide further.

The question that generated the biggest response was question 7, "if LCS provided for year 9 & 10 would you consider keeping your child at the school past year 8?" Fifty percent of respondents said yes, 26% maybe and 24% no. The board of trustees and our proprietor the Dunedin Christian Schools Association have both agreed in principle that this response requires more investigation needs to be made into the feasibility of this for our school and the operational implications.

Recently a small group visited Timaru Christian school to see what their year 9 & 10 class looks like and to gather information. During term 2 we will host a meeting for parents who are interested to know more, and to answer some of the many questions raised in the survey around this topic.

The final four questions asked about our areas of strength and weakness concerning curriculum and our future planning. The high number of comments gave the board encouraging confirmation in many areas and a broad range of ideas to think through as well.
