

Welcome New Teachers!

They will be given a consent form to take home to their parents/caregivers. If you do not wish for your child to partake in the education please contact the school.

Please read the consent form carefully, fill it out in pen and return it to school ASAP, even if you do not consent for your child to be vaccinated at school.

No student will be vaccinated without their parent/caregiver's consent. The HPV vaccination is also available free of charge through your practice Internet Banking details nurse or doctor up to their 26<sup>th</sup> birthday.

### School of Dentistry Dental Therapy Clinic

Clinics will resume soon with students being taken to the dental hub on Friday mornings. Dental appointments are arranged directly with parents and we do not have records at school of who has been. Please also be vigilant in signing and dropping all dental clinic forms to the office prior to appointments.

### LCS Sun Hat Procedure term 1 (and 4)

During terms 1 and 4 we require all students to wear a sun hat during morning tea and lunch breaks and for extended outdoor class activities to ensure students are safe from sun burn. Students without a hat will be required to play under the cover of the shed veranda on outside play days. Please help your child enjoy outside play at school by checking they have a hat each day. Hats should be named and are able to be left at school each day.

### Absences and Regular Lateness

If your child needs to be absent from school please notify the school office by phone or email by 9am on the morning of the absence, sending a note with a sibling or leaving a message on the answer phone. We are required to report absences (and reasons for absence) to the MOE when a student is absent for more than five days accumulated over the term. For planned absence (e.g. travel) please supply a note or email to the class teacher or office.
