Thinking About Christian Education

Parents are primarily responsible for the education of children. That doesn't mean that they are the ones who have to do the actual teaching, but they are the ones who are commissioned by God to make certain that children receive an education that is God-centered and God honouring. This was true during the Old Testament era (see Deut 6:1-9 and Ps 78:1-8). This was also true in the early church. The apostle Paul tells fathers in particular to bring up their children in "the nurture and admonition of the Lord" (Eph 6:4 KJV). This nurture includes instruction and correction, and both must be "of the Lord". The state is never mentioned in the Bible as being responsible for education. Even the church's role in education is secondary to that of the parents. Consequently, one of the most important choices that parents must make is that of a school for their children.
