



#### Board of Trustees' News: Summary of LCS Parent Survey 2019

We would like to thank everyone for taking the time to respond to our Parent Survey this year. The responses were very positive in terms of the school providing a safe and positive learning environment and the partnership between home and school life.

One specific area we looked at for 2019 was around fundraising. In particular, parents and caregivers feeling informed of fundraising opportunities, along with any difficulties that that school may be able to assist with to help with contribution to fundraising. 















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
