




## **Board of Trustees Policy Review Cycle**

#### **Board of Trustees' News: MOE Donations Scheme**

As previously announced, the Board of Trustees has opted-in to the Ministry of Education Donations Scheme. This means our school is not asking parents for an activity donation to support the board in providing a number of the activities we undertake across the school year. In addition, the board prioritised a \$10 subsidy per item for our school sports shirt and hoodie, and netball, basketball and badminton team fees will be reduced this year.
