#### YEAR SEVEN VISION SCREENING

The Vision Hearing Technicians from Population Health team, Southern District Health will be visiting school to screen all year seven students for distance vision on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> March.

#### **Distance Vision (Amblyopia & Hyperopia)**

This determines how well your child can see at a distance. It involves reading an eye chart.



(This free vision check is not required if student wears glasses and/or is currently under care of an optometrist or eye specialist).

If you do not wish your child to be screened, please fill out an opt-out slip, which are available at the school office, before our visit.

The Dunedin Christian Schools Association (DCSA) is holding its annual meeting on Tuesday 28 March at 7.30pm in the staffroom at school. Members and friends of the school are encouraged to attend as we reflect on and celebrate together the previous year of work and achievement. The DCSA plays a crucial role in our school as it is the owner of our school property and is charged with ensuring the special character of the school is up-held. The special character of the school is determined by the Christian world and life view of the DCSA as

outlined in Articles three and four of the Constitution.

The DCSA also identifies property needs and funds our capital expenditure projects, e.g. in 2022 they fixed the basement water issue, replaced the junior playground matting and resurfaced the front area of the school.

DCSA members are able to be nominated by the governing council as proprietor representatives on the school board of trustees.

### DUNEDIN CHRISTIAN SCHOOLS ASSOCIATION AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES PRAYER REQUEST

The Dunedin Christian Schools Association (DCSA), our proprietor, with the Board of Trustees (BOT), has recently submitted an Expression of Interest (EOI) to the Ministry of Education to increase our maximum roll cap. If the EOI is supported by the local Ministry of Education office it will go to the Wellington office to be considered by the Minister for Education.

Our school has a roll cap of 110 students. With the addition of the junior block in 2021 we have the capacity to enrol up to 140 students with our current facilities. Both the DCSA and BOT have a vision to serve more families in Christian education.

We ask you to join us in prayer for the EOI to be successful. Our school is funded to operate five classrooms. The BOT is funding the sixth classroom using capital reserves we are blessed to have available for 2023. Ultimately we need to gain a roll cap increase to keep operating six classes as this additional expenditure is not within our financial means for the long term.
