## TEN YEARS OLD ! - ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS -

**T**HIS YEAR LIBERTON CHRISTIAN SCHOOL celebrates its tenth birthday but the history of the school extends back to at least June 1978 when an interim Board was established at a public meeting to work on formally establishing the Dunedin Christian Schools Association. After six months work on the structure and constitution of the new organisation, the DCSA was officially established in December 1978. Many of the founding members of the Association remain actively involved. For the first two years the DCSA focused on developing an educational philosophy, encouraging membership from the wider Christian community, raising funds, and looking for a suitable site for a school.

In early 1981 we heard that the Roman Catholic Church was thinking of selling the Rosary School in Pinehill. After examining the facilities, discussions with the membership, and prayerful consideration of the financial responsibilities, the DCSA and a head with the purchase of the school in August 1981. Acquiring the school was only the beginning. Over the next six months a lot of work was required to improve the facility, find a teacher, develop the school curriculum and meet the requirements for registration with the Department of Education. However, all was achieved, with the official opening of Liberton Christian School in February 1982. Mr Theo Prucha was the first teacher with a roll of 20 pupils. Since then the school has grown considerably, and we now have three teachers and a roll of 64.

This description of the founding and short history of Liberton Christian would be incomplete without record of the hard work and commitment of teachers, parents and members of the Association in supporting the life and work of the school. At times we have struggled together to sustain the school and occasionally we have perhaps found it

difficult to believe that we would be able to survive another year. Yet the school is not ours alone. It is part of the Kingdom of God, a place were we work to present, develop and live-out a Christian world and life view that seeks to acknowledge the Lordship of Christ. At times of frustration and anxiety the Lord has graciously met our needs, often in unexpected ways, and challenged us to persevere.

On Sunday the 26th July at 2:00 pm we will be celebrating our tenth anniversary at the school in a worship service that will involve the children. Please join us for this celebration as we thank God together.

## THE DUNEDIN CHRISTIAN SCHOOLS ASSOCIATION AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES PRAYER REQUEST

The Dunedin Christian Schools Association (DCSA), our proprietor, with the Board of Trustees (BOT), has recently submitted an Expression of Interest (EOI) to the Ministry of Education to increase our maximum roll cap. **We have great news!** The EOI was accepted and we are now about to take the next step of applying for a Maximum Roll Increase (MRI).

Our school has a roll cap of 110 students. With the addition of the junior block in 2021 we have the capacity to enrol up to 140 students with our current facilities. Both the DCSA and BOT have a vision to serve more families in Christian education.

We ask you to join us in prayer for the MRI application to go smoothly and be successful. Our school is funded to operate five classrooms. The BOT is funding the sixth classroom using capital reserves we are blessed to have available for 2023. Ultimately we need to gain a roll cap increase to keep operating six classes as this additional expenditure is not within our financial means for the long term.


