
## LIBERTON CHRISTIAN SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

## **SAFETY AT THE SCHOOL GATE**

Thank you for helping keep all students safe at the school gate at 3pm, by not parking on the yellow lines or over the main gate area.

The Dunedin City Council have put 30k/m signs on Pine Hill Road creating a school zone around drop off and pick up times.
