Today we walked up Pine Hill Road to the Hope Church (previously St Mark's) and enjoyed an Easter service led by Mrs Barton. Our prayers were answered for dry weather for the walk there and back, and Hope Church gave us a very warm welcome. Mrs Barton's faithful service to the Pine Hill community is remarkable and we are thankful for it.

The Dunedin Christian Schools Association (DCSA), our Proprietor, with the Board of Trustees (BOT), has recently submitted a Maximum Roll Increase (MRI) application to the Ministry of Education to increase our maximum roll cap.

Our school has a roll cap of 110 students. With the addition of the junior block in 2021 we have the capacity to enrol up to 140 students with our current facilities. Both the DCSA and BOT have the vision to serve more families in Christian education.

Please join us in prayer for the MRI application to be successful. Our school is funded to operate five classrooms. The BOT is funding the sixth classroom using capital reserves we are blessed to have available for 2024. Ultimately we need to gain a roll cap increase to keep operating six classes as this additional expenditure is not within our ongoing financial means.

As we move into the Easter weekend, we trust you will have a blessed time of reflection and some rest too.
