


Please note the dates and information for our important last two weeks of term in this newsletter. We look forward to sharing our production, and our Thank You and Graduation assemblies with you.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2026

As our school has been blessed to grow over the last two years, and is growing again next year, we need to make adjustments to some of our administration systems. Next year we are introducing a new system for stationery. We will be ordering stationery packs for students from our supplier rather than ordering bulk stationery and packing it at school. Our stationery prices will continue to be excellent as we are part of the All of Government scheme which keeps the pricing very competitive. Parents will be invoiced for stationery at the end of January and the stationery will be available to students on the first day of school. We are excited to streamline this aspect of schooling which will be easier for parents and our administration team.
